<p>Missing Consonants</p> <p>Write your spelling words in a list, but replace all the consonants with a line. There's a rat in separate!</p> <p>You hear with your ear.</p> <p>There are keys in donkeys and monkey</p> <p>The villain lived in a villa.</p>	<p>Shout it out!</p> <p>Say the words in a memorable way, pronouncing silent letters or 'hidden' syllables</p> <p>natural → say na-tu-ral</p> <p>February → say Feb-ru-ary</p> <p>interest → say in-ter-est</p>	<p>Mnemonics</p> <p>We all say "br" in February</p> <p>necessary: my shirt has one collar and two sleeves.</p> <p>rhythm : rhythm helps your two hips move</p> <p>laugh: Laugh and u get happy!</p> <p>because: Big elephants can't always use small exits</p> <p>could/would/should : o u lucky duck</p> <p>stationary has ar like car</p> <p>stationery has e for envelope</p>	<p>Spelling Shapes</p> <p>Draw around the word to show the shape</p> <div></div> <p>Now try drawing the shape and filling in the word!</p>
<p>Colour-me-Vowels</p> <p>Write out your spellings. Then, using a coloured pencil, trace over the vowels in each word.</p> <p>The vowels are : A E I O U</p> <p>All other letters in the alphabet are called consonants</p>	<p>Super Silly Sentences</p> <p>Write a super sentence for each one of your spelling words.</p> <p>Your sentence could be interesting, exciting or even silly!</p> <p><i>The boy devoured a dictionary and suddenly knew the meaning of every word in the universe!</i></p>	<p>Spelling tennis</p> <p>One person starts with a letter, the other adds one until a word is made.</p> <p>The last person to add a letter wins. – but only if the word is spelt correctly!</p> <p>If the word is spelt wrong – check where it went wrong and have another go!</p>	<p>Pyramid words</p> <p>Make a pyramid out of your spelling words!</p> <div><div>s sh sho shou shoul should</div><div>b be bec beca becau becaus because</div></div>	<p>Secret Agent</p> <p>Number the alphabet from 1-26. a=1, b=2, c=3, d=4, etc. Then convert some of your words to a number code. Add up the numbers and see which word gives the highest or lowest total?</p> <p>group = 7+18+15+21+16 = 77</p> <p>fruit = 6+18+21+9+20 = 74</p>
<p>Bubble writing</p> <p>Write the word in bubble writing and write inside it or colour it in.</p>	<p>Rainbow words</p> <p>Break the word down into syllables and write each part in a different colour.</p> <p>particular → particular</p>	<p>Tracing</p> <p>Write your word down and trace over it 5 times with different colours</p>	<p>Syllable Chop</p> <p>Write each spelling word out. Chop the word into syllables.</p> <p>September → Sep / tem / ber</p> <p>surprise → sur / prise</p> <p>impossible → im / poss / i / ble</p>	<p>Make a Wordsearch</p> <p>Make a wordsearch using a grid of all your spelling words. Come back later and find your words!</p>
<p>Dot-to-Dot</p> <p>Write your spelling words using dots. Connect the dots you've drawn by tracing over them with a coloured pencil.</p>	<p>Look, say, cover, write, check</p> <p>✓ Look at the word</p> <p>✓ Say it out loud</p> <p>✓ Cover the word</p> <p>✓ Write the word from memory</p> <p>✓ Check – have you got it right?</p>	<p>Matching Pairs</p> <p>Find matching words which contain the same spelling pattern.</p> <p>eight / weight</p> <p>mischievous / marvellous</p>	<p>Three Times</p> <p>Write your word down three times – each time use a different colour pen or pencil.</p> <p>medicine medicine medicine</p>	<p>Hangman</p> <p>Play hangman with a partner, using the words you are learning.</p>
