### **Dignity Statement**

Kingsway Junior School is committed to providing a learning environment where all children are treated with dignity and respect. As stated in the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child, all children are born with dignity, which cannot be taken away, regardless of behaviour, ability, disability, race, economic background, gender, sexuality or beliefs. Duty Bearers' protection of children's rights affords them this dignity and enables them to access education free from barriers.

## School uniform

Any family struggling to follow provide uniform due to financial difficulties – please talk to us at school so we can put a plan in place to help you.

We also have small amount of Pre-Loved Uniform available in the Reception Area.

Governors, Parents and Teachers fully support the wearing of school uniform – we would appreciate your cooperation with this.

### Uniform – All pupils

- Grey or black style trousers or skirt
- White shirt, blouse or polo. Shirts must be tucked in at all times.
- Red jumper / sweatshirt (no logos or designs other than school logo)
- Black school shoes (no platforms or heels)

- If children are wearing inappropriate footwear or footwear that does not follow the policy, they will be given spare plimsolls.
- Trainers should only be worn for PE or break/ lunch time
- White, black, red or grey tights or socks
- All pupils must have a coat – children are sent out in rain and the cold
- An old shirt or apron for Art. A small supply is available to be used as spares.



### Summer – All pupils

- Grey or black shorts or red and white checked dress.
- Sandals are not permitted due to health and safety
- Hats to protect children from the sun



## Accessories – all pupils

- Watches may be worn
- Medic Alert bracelets must be worn when necessary and the head teacher should be informed
- Simple plain studs may be worn but must be removed or covered with tape for PE
- Small items of religious significance may be worn on a small chain where necessary and the head teacher should be informed
- Friendship bracelets, charity bands, wristbands or snap bands and ankle chains are not permitted
- Nail polish is not acceptable.

## Hair – all pupils

- Hair, which is long enough to be tied back, should be, regardless of gender, in order to not obscure vision.
- Children may have braids, but again, these should be tied back and of a natural colour without beads.
- Long hair should be fully tied back – not in a half up, half down style.
- Hair bands, ribbons/bows or ‘scrunchies’ should be plain and discreet. Hair bands should not have large attachments such as big flowers.
- Extreme hairstyles are not appropriate for school.
- The use of styling products should be kept to a minimum and children should not have decorative patterns cut into their hair or have hair coloured or dyed.
- Closely shaved styles such as a ‘fade’ are not appropriate for school.

## PE kits

These will be sent home for washing at the end of every half term but can be washed more regularly. They need to be in school every day.



If children do not have a PE kit in school, a spare kit will be given to the children.

- Black plimsolls or trainers – these need to be different from their daily uniform
- Black Football style shorts (not cycling shorts or “Nike pro style” shorts)
- Black/ navy or grey tracksuit (no large logos or designs) or black leggings
- Red, Blue, Green or Yellow t-shirt depending on House.
